

### *A few words on monitoring*

For effective implementation of laws on reservation and its allied aspects, it is of utmost importance to monitor the performance from time to time. For this purpose some returns and reports have been prescribed. Orders and formats on these have been incorporated here besides those which already form part of the main Rules.

2. Under the West Bengal Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Reservation of Vacancies in Services and Posts) Rules, 1976 as amended up-to-date every appointing authority is required to send to the concerned Administrative Department or Head of Office as soon after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January as possible and latest by the first day of March statements showing total number of employees and the number of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes amongst them as on 1<sup>st</sup> January of the year as also a statement showing the particulars of recruitment during the calendar year and the number filled by the Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes amongst them. The Administrative Head of every Govt Department is required to send consolidated report in these matters in respect of all offices under his control including his own to the Backward Classes Welfare Department. Prescribed forms for submission of these reports have been appended to the Rules mentioned herein.

3. Apart from the Annual Report discussed in Para 2 above, quarterly reports on issue of caste identification certificates are required to be submitted to Director, Backward Classes Welfare as also to this Department by all certificate issuing authorities in the format as prescribed and included here, by the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month following the quarter under report.

4. To see how far the appointing authorities are complying with requirements of law of reservation there is provision for inspection of the establishments. Inspectors of Backward Classes Welfare Department have been required to carry out such inspection and submit a monthly report by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month following the month under report.

5. To keep tab on dereservation of reserved vacancies all authorities competent to dereserve such vacancies have been asked to submit monthly report on such matters in the prescribed format as included herein.

6. The Department of Backward Classes Welfare envisages to monitor implementation of Reservation and allied Acts and Rules and be apprised of the field situation in these matters through these reports and returns.

7. Besides, the Department of Backward Classes Welfare is required to send an Annual Reports on implementation of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 to Govt. of India in the format prescribed by them. Govt. of India has also prescribed a time schedule for initiation and preparation of the report at different levels. Crime statistics and related data and information for the purpose of this report are to be furnished by the Home Department of this Government. The format of the report and the prescribed time schedule for initiation and submission of the same have been annexed hereto. Though Govt. of India's letter prescribing the formats etc given here relate to the year 1998-99, it is generally valid for all Annual Reports. It has to be borne in mind while furnishing the crime statistics in the Annual Report in respect of implementation of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 that only crimes enumerated in section 3 of the Act and **committed by persons not being of SC/ST communities** against members of SC/ST communities are to be treated as atrocities and to be included in the statistical part of the report.

*Subject:* Regular submission of quarterly report relating to disposal application for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/Other Backward classes Certificates

The undersigned is to refer to Memo No. 697(70)-TW/EC, dated 01.08.1995 of the erstwhile Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Welfare Department (now re-named Backward Class Welfare Department) where-under all certificate issuing authorities were to furnish a quarterly and a monthly report on issuance of certificates to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes applicants and Other Backward Classes applicants respectively through the Director of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Welfare in the proforma prescribed therein. As much inconvenience was being experienced in the matter of compilation of the two separate reports and in view of the fact that these reports were not being received regularly, Government has been considering for sometimes past the question of simplifying the proforma and the manner of submission of the reports.

After careful consideration of all aspects, it has now been decided that there shall be a single report incorporating status of applications for all categories of Castes and Tribes certificates and the proforma for the report has, accordingly, been revised. The report is to be submitted in the revised proforma once in every quarter by the certificate issuing authorities to the Director, Backward Classes Welfare with a copy to this Department so as to reach the Directorate by the 10<sup>th</sup> of the Month following the closure of the quarter, to which the report relates. The Director shall compile the reports and submit the District-wise consolidated figures to the Department within the last working day of the month following the quarter to which the report relates.

A copy of the revised format for the said report is enclosed. All concerned should strictly maintain the above time-schedule for submission of the report.

### **MEMORANDUM**

The undersigned is directed to say that an analysis of Annual Reports so far received from different Departments indicates that there is a large shortfall in the matter of fulfillment of prescribed percentage of reservation in employment for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. In regard to Backward Classes also, which is of comparatively recent origin, the position is not much better.

2. As inspection of the Establishments is an important instrument for enforcement of Laws of Reservation, it is considered necessary to conduct regular inspection of the Establishments. Project Officer-cum-District Welfare Officer/Backward Classes Welfare Officer/District Welfare Officers have been asked to utilise the services of the Inspectors posted in the Blocks and Sub-divisions for developmental work, in Reservation work particularly in the matter of inspection and maintenance of records of educational institutions within their respective jurisdiction.

3. The undersigned is now directed to request District Magistrates and District Reservation Commissioners to arrange for regular inspection of establishments in a phased manner. While necessary action on the basis of such inspections shall be taken by the concerned District Magistrates & District Reservation Commissioners, District Reservation Inspectors shall be required to submit a monthly report on inspection in the enclosed proforma, duly countersigned by the District Magistrates & District Reservation Commissioners so as to reach the Assistant Commissioner for Reservation & ex-officio Assistant Secretary by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month following.

4. In respect of establishments and institutions located in Kolkata, the Inspectors attached to the Reservation Cell of the department shall conduct similar inspection and submit similar reports to the Assistant Commissioner for Reservation & ex-officio Assistant Secretary by the Scheduled date.

5. The report shall also include inspection conducted on specific complaints.

6. This will take effect from 1<sup>st</sup> of August, 2001 and the first report should be available by the 15<sup>th</sup> of September, 2001.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the above subject and to say that under Section 21(4) of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989, the Central Government is required to place on the Table of each House of Parliament, a report on the measures taken by itself and by the State Governments in pursuance of the provisions contained in the Act, and Rules.

2. The State Governments / UT administrations are required to furnish information on the measures taken by them on the implementation of various provisions contained in the Act, as well as Rules provisions 1995 under the Act during the calendar year 1999. Such materials / information under the following headings:

- i) Provision of adequate facilities including **legal aid** to persons subjected to atrocities.
- ii) Provision for **travelling and maintenance expenses** to witnesses including the victims of atrocities.
- iii) Provision for the economic and social rehabilitation of the victims of atrocities.
- iv) **Appointment of officers** for initiating or exercising supervision over prosecutions for contravention of the provision of the Act.
- v) Setting up of committees at appropriate levels in formulation and implementation of the measures.
- vi) Provision for **periodic survey** on the working of the provisions of the Act.
- vii) **Identification of the areas** where the members of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are likely to be **subjected to atrocities** and adoption of such measures to ensure safety for such members.
- viii) Efforts for involving NGOs.

3. It is further requested that statistical details showing the number of cases registered under the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 and their disposal during the calendar year 1999 may also be furnished in the prescribed proforma (Copy enclosed). While furnishing the information details / analysis of 4 major atrocity cases in 1999 may also be furnished.

4. The details about the number of cases pending with police for over one year with reasons therefor, number of cases in which appeal has been filed in the Appellate courts against the judgment given by the lower courts (i. e. cases ended in acquittal) during the period under reference may also be furnished (enclosed annexure – I & II)

5. It is further requested that the details showing the expenditure incurred under this Act, during 1998-99 may also be furnished in the prescribed proforma. (enclosed annexure – III).

6. Under Rule 18 of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Rules, 1995 the State Governments / UT administrations are required to forward, before the **28<sup>th</sup> February, 2000** a report to the Central Government about the measures undertaken for implementing the provisions of the Act, various schemes / plans framed by them during the previous calendar year. The report may kindly be furnished before that date to enable this Ministry to place the Annual Report before the Parliament in time.

Sir,

As per provision under Section 21(4) of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989, the Central Government is required to coordinate the measures taken by the State Government for implementation of the provisions contained in the Act and Rules and place a report on the Table of each House of Parliament on the measures taken by itself and the State Governments in pursuance of the provisions contained in Section 21(4).

**Part-I** giving a summary of the measures taken by various State Governments/UT Administrations, for implementation of provisions contained in section 21(4) of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989, viz. legal aid, travelling and maintenance expenses, economic and social rehabilitation, appointment of officers, setting up of committees at appropriate levels, Special Courts, periodical surveys, identification of areas subject to atrocities and other measures to ensure removal of atrocities.

**Part-II** giving relevant Statistical details of cases registered under the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 and their disposal during the Calendar year reported upon. This may be sent in form of a statement of number of cases registered and disposed of, as given at Annexure I, II.

**Part-III** giving statistical information on details of expenditure incurred for implementation of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 (Annexure III)

2. In the past, it has been experienced that there has been unusual delay in sending the information. In some cases, statistical details of cases furnished by the States / UTs do not tally

with figures given in different columns and not consistent with data furnished for earlier years. This has affected preparation and submission of report to the Parliament by this Ministry.

3. Under Rule 18 of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Rules, 1995 the State Governments / UT Administrations are required to forward before the 31<sup>st</sup> March a report to the Central Government about the measure undertaken for implementing the provisions of the Act, various schemes/plans framed by them during the previous Calendar year. This Ministry earlier letter dated 1.8.2000 (copy enclosed) may please be referred to in this regard.

4. I would therefore, request you to kindly arrange for sending relevant information at the earliest so that the Annual Report could be compiled and laid on the Table of both the Houses of Parliament in time.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to this Ministry's earlier d. o. letter No. 11020/1/98-PCR(DESK) dated 24.2.2000, regarding effective implementation of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 and to draw your kind attention to Rule 18 of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Rules, 1995, which reads as under:-

“ The State Government shall every, before the 31<sup>st</sup> March, forward the report to the Central government about the measures taken for implementing provisions of the Act and various schemes/plans framed by it during the previous calendar year.” Committee on papers laid on the Table of Rajya Sabha has desired that the Annual Report should be laid by 30<sup>th</sup> September of the succeeding year.

Accordingly, concerned authorities in the State Government have been requested from time to time for sending relevant information on implementation of the Act, such as number of cases registered by Police, Status of disposal by Courts etc. However, there has been unusual delay in getting detail information from the states. In some cases, the report sent by the States are incomplete. As a result, compilation of information and preparation of report for the year is getting delayed, which has become a matter of concern.

With a view to ensure that the annual report is prepared and sent to the Parliament in time, it has been necessary to give specific attention and process the matter as per time schedule given below:

Sir,

As you are aware, as per provision under the Protection of Civil Rights Acts, 1955 and SCs and STs (prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989, action taken by the State Government/UT Administrations during a particular calendar year in compliance with provisions of these two Acts is required to be sent by 15<sup>th</sup> February and 31<sup>st</sup> March respectively of the next calendar year. The Annual Report on implementation of these two Acts during a calendar year is compiled by this Ministry and laid in both the Houses of the Parliament based on these information. It has been noticed that preparation and laying of the reports is getting delayed, due to the delay in getting relevant information from the State Government/UT Administrations. The parliamentary Committees have expressed their concern over this delay and have recommended for taking necessary steps for laying the report in time.

2. In course of consultations with the Ministry of Home Affairs, it appears that National Crime Record Bureau (NCRB) is also compiling information in respect of registration, investigation as well as on trial of the cases registered under these Acts. As information sent to this Ministry under these two Acts is similar to those being compiled by the NCRB, it is necessary that information may be verified and authenticated by State Police Headquarters before it is sent by the State Government/UT Administration to this Ministry. The format for sending information on number of cases registered and investigation/trial of the cases during the year under these two Acts of this Ministry have been revised for having uniformity, with the formats being followed by the NCRB. Copy of the revised format for Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955 and Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 are enclosed at Annexure I – A&B and II A&B respectively.

3. I would request you to kindly give your personal attention to the matter and arrange for sending relevant details on the measures taken by your State/UT Administration on implementation of the Act as well as relevant figures in the format enclosed for the current year 2000 at the earliest. I would also request you to give particular attention to ensure that the number of cases shown, as brought forward from the previous year in Column 2 is reported keeping in view the information sent earlier for the current year.
